AMAZONE is the last pre-war pedigree motor yacht of her size available for restoration. Launched in August 1936, AMAZONE was built to a very high standard by John I Thornycroft & Co. in Southampton. This is a yacht with significant potential. She has good interior volumes, significant deck space and a fine sea going hull form.

Commissioned by Commandant L. Hemeleers-Schenly, the For the last twenty-four years she was a houseboat on Belgian military attaché in London, Amazone served in the Royal Navy during World War II, after which she was acquired by Viscount Portal.


In the 1950s she was owned by the Australian aviator and spy Sidney Cotton during which time the Duke and Duchess of Windsor cruised on board.


In the 1980s AMAZONE was extensively modernised and put to work as a charter yacht under the name Welsh Liberty.




